Digging Deeper

[Use these readings to prepare you for worship next week!]

Monday: 07.16.2012

Prayer Focus: Our church leadership

Passage: Jeremiah 3:6-25

Insight: Many of the prophets used the language of an unfaithful wife to describe how God was being treated by his people. We can easily recognize that God was not subtle or gentle in calling his people back to them, because he was jealous for them! However, even while calling his people unfaithful, he declares his deep desire to treat them with love and compassion.

How are you being faithful to God in your life? What does you feel about the idea that God eagerly desires to treat you with love and compassion?

Tuesday: 07.17.2012

Prayer Focus: The Flushing Community

Passage: 2 Kings 17:1-40

Insight: Finally, after years of disobedience, God is bringing a deep and lasting punishment on his people. "All this took place because the Israelites had sinned against the LORD their God." The people are separated and the land is taken control of by Assyria. It seems as if all the things that God had given to his people were now stripped away forever.

How do you think that the Israelites felt towards God as they were being taken into captivity? Did they blame him for their troubles, or did they turn to him for help? How do you respond to God in times of trouble?

Wednesday: 07.18.2012

Prayer Focus: Our nation

Passage: Lamentations 5:1-22

Insight: Jeremiah writes with the voice of the people after Jerusalem has finally fallen to a long and bitter siege. The pictures painted by Jeremiah tell of terrible misery and suffering, but most of all the desperate fear that God has finally given up his people.

Do you hear the agony of the people in Jeremiah's writings? As our Father, do you think that God shares in the agony of his own people?

Thursday: 07.19.2012

Prayer Focus: Intercession (use the iPray Guide)

Passage: Leviticus 26:14-45

Insight: How often do we read about God allowing his people to be punished, and we conclude that God is impatient and angry? Today we read the conclusion of the ancient Law given to God's people to remember that, from the very beginning, God has been consistent with his people. When we look at how long God waited, and how many times he called his people to repent and turn to him, we discover that he is indeed a very patient and compassionate God.

How do you observe God's faithfulness in this ancient law?

Friday: 07.20.2012

Prayer Focus: Our upcoming service (Story of God #5)

Passage: Isaiah 51:1-16

Insight: Even in the middle of God directing Isaiah to tell the people of the coming destruction, he promises them restoration. God is always faithful to his promises, even when it looks differently than we expected.

How do you hear God's promise to his people through the voice of Isaiah?
